Composting, informing students what composting means, how it is done, what can be turned into a compost and what can't.







Reflection by Save The Earth ambassadors on their experience at <u>Dunman</u> High for World Water Festival on the 8 of March.


Pupils created a skit that creates awareness of sustaining and protecting Singapore's 4 National Taps and how individuals can preserve and protect our precious water resources.

Composting of food scraps

Canteen vendors are told to throw their food waste in a container provided to each stall. These containers were then collected from them daily to be composted in the machine. The compost will then be used as fertilisers for our school gardens. The amount of compost produced each term is about 4-5kg.













- Introduce different portion sizes

Posters are put up to remind students not to waste food and to help turn their food waste into fertilisers

- 2nd hand uniform exchange/ sale

2nd hand uniform are collected by parent volunteers on Reuse Our School uniform Day with Mothers in term 4 every year. These uniform are distributed to students under financial assistance scheme in term 1 the following year.



-Condemned library books

Instead of throwing away condemned books from our school library, they are placed at the school inner courtyard, free for students to take or borrow. Students who do not have a book to read during our morning reading programme at the courtyard can also borrow these books.



-Storybook Donation Drive

In term 4, students were encouraged to donate their used story books to the school library. The donation drive has just begun, and the responses from students were positive so far, as seen in the last picture. Due to impending renovation for our school library, these books will not be displayed until renovation is completed end of the year.





- Recycling awareness reminders and campaigns
- 1. At the start of the term, 2 Save The Earth Ambassadors were appointed for each class. Their

duty was to put up recycle bin for paper in the classrooms and encourage their classmates to do their part in recycling, especially paper.

It is placed in the canteen.




